The Nuts & Bolts of Ballfield Construction and How to Take Care of Your Investment

Tree Protection & Maintenance

We will cover the basics of tree biology, tree planting and establishment, irrigation, pruning, mulching, and how to protect trees in public spaces. This will be an outside session.

Aeration for Sports Turf and Public Turf Spaces

Facilities both public and private are under pressure to keep nice turf spaces for increased usage without relying on chemicals and under tight budget constraints. This session will focus on aeration strategies to build healthy root zones that will maximize fertilization inputs, help mitigate disease factors, and keep turf areas open and playable. Proper Disposal Practices in Public Spaces

Case studies and physical examples will be used to convey the most successful local and regional tactics in public spaces.

Signage Tips

Interactive discussion of typical signage issues and challenges will be encouraged.

Practical ADA Assessment Walk-through
